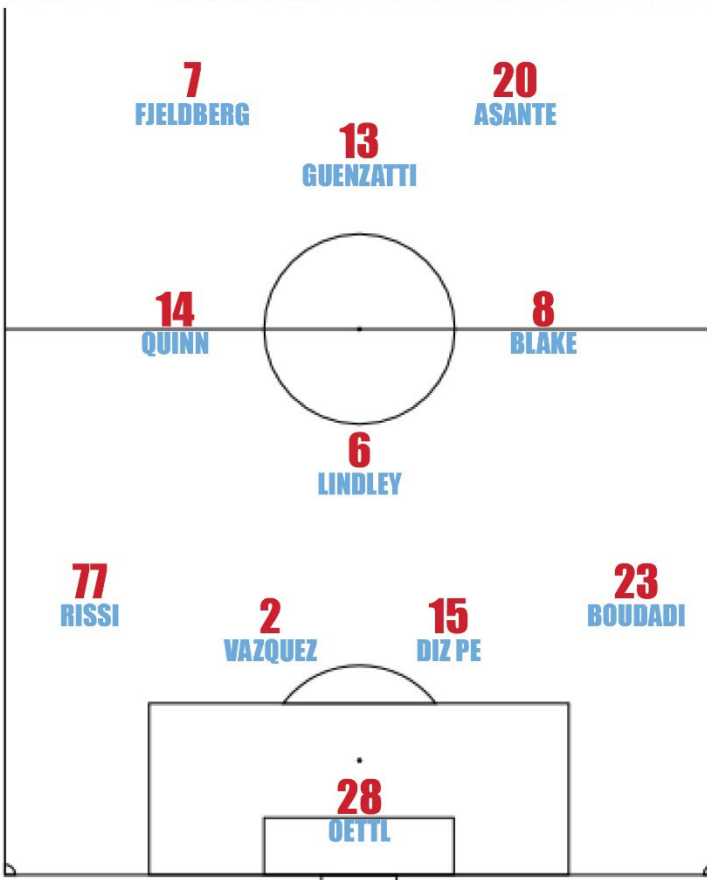

INDY'S TENTH SEASON STARTS IN TAMPA: Last Sunday, the IndyCar circuit began its 2023 campaign by driving around Al Lang Stadium on the streets of St. Petersburg. Six days later, Indy Eleven will rev up its own 2023 season inside the venerable venue against the Tampa Bay Rowdies in one of the marquee match-ups of a crowded USL Championship opening night slate.

For Indy Eleven, Saturday offers a stiff first test for its new-look side against one of the Eastern Conference's most steady and successful sides in recent years. While Head Coach Mark Lowry has preached during preseason that Week One will not look like a finished product, the insertion of veterans Cam Lindley, Aodhan Quinn and Jack Blake in the midfield; Sebastian Guenzatti at forward; Adrian Diz Pe, Gustavo Rissi, and Younes Boudadi on the backline; and Yannik Oettl between the posts gives the Boys in Blue tons of added Championship experience and poise up and down the pitch – and the ability to take three points out of any contest, regardless of how it may look aesthetically for the time being.

That's not to discount the offerings of several key returnees, including a loaded corps of attacking players in MVP Solomon Asante, Jonas Fjeldberg (back from his loan

with Rio Grande Valley FC), and Juan Tejada. Defenders Jesus Vazquez, Robby Dambrot (ruled out due to injury for the opener), and Mechack Jerome and goalkeeper Tim Triik also provide experience in Lowry's system, with all starting at least 11 contests during their debut seasons in the Circle City last year. Additionally, the return of Eleven Academy product Alann Torres from a season-long loan with USL League One's Forward Madison FC and loan acquisition of Harrison Robledo from FC Cincinnati gives Lowry some young and versatile options to throw into the mix.

Tampa Bay represents one of the Eleven's most well-known foes, the squads meeting 15 times since Indy Eleven debuted back in the NASL in 2014; only Louisville City FC (19) and the Carolina RailHawks/North Carolina FC (16) have squared off more times against the Boys in Blue during their previous nine seasons on play.

The Rowdies broke the stalemate in the all-time series in the previous outing last July 30 at Carroll Stadium courtesy of a 3-1 win. Raul Aguilera's 24th minute opener pushed Indy into the lead, but that was offset by Steevan Dos Santos (32') and Leo Fernandes (96+') penalty conversions and a Jordan Scarlett backbreaker just before halftime in between.

Their last meeting at Al Lang Stadium was another early-season affair last March 19, a 2-0 Rowdies victory that saw current Eleven striker Juan Tejada score inside the first minute and assist on Jake LaCava's 51st insurance goal.

While Indiana's Team is still seeking its first win in St. Petersburg in USL Championship play (2 losses, 1 draw), it went undefeated in its first four forays to the Gulf Coast, compiling a win and three draws in NASL play between 2014-16.

FUN FACT: 17 different Indy players have scored the team's 18 all-time goals against the Rowdies. The only player to tally twice against Tampa Bay? Honduran center back Erick Norales, who scored in their first-ever meeting on April 19, 2014, (1-1 draw) and the insurance goal in a 2-0 victory on Aug. 19, 2015, both at Carroll Stadium.

#INDvTBR FAMILIAR FACES:

The Eleven's Sebastian Guenzatti, Juan Tejada, and Jack Blake have all suited up for Tampa Bay to varying degrees over the years.

The most notable homecoming will be for Guenzatti, who became the Rowdies' career leading scorer with 65 goals (59 regular season, 6 postseason) from 2017-22, during which he also contributed 19 assists in 160 matches in official competitions. The forward led Tampa Bay in scoring in four straight seasons from 2018-21 and played a vital role in the Rowdies' success in recent years, which included USL Championship Eastern Conference titles in 2020 and 2021, another Conference Championship game appearance in 2022, and the league's top regular season mark in 2021.

Tejada is no stranger to Al Lang Stadium either, as the Panamanian striker spent three-and-a-half seasons with Tampa Bay prior to his trade to Indy for Nicky Law last July. Tejada tallied 13 goals and 5 assists in 68 USL Championship regular season appearances for Tampa Bay from 2019-22 and also played in five postseason contests.

Blake began his tenure in the USL Championship by originally heading on loan from Lowry's Jacksonville Armada FC side prior to the 2018 season, a deal that ultimately saw Blake sign a permanent contract with the Rowdies at the start of the season. However, a midseason trade to Real Monarchs SLC saw his time on the Gulf Coast cut short, ending with a goal and two assists in seven appearances for the Nottingham native.

On the flip side, Tampa Bay technically has two former Boys in Blue on their 2023 roster, although only one ever saw the field for Indiana's Team. That would be defender Connor Antley, who suited up for the Boys in Blue 12 times during the squad's COVID-shortened 16-game season in 2020. Meanwhile, the Cal Jennings era in the Circle City never got off the ground, as the forward signed with the squad in December 2020 but was turned around via transfer to Major League Soccer's Los Angeles FC in early March 2021.

Open Up: Indy Eleven's inaugural match against the Carolina RailHawks on April 12, 2014 (a 1-1 draw at Carroll Stadium), marked the first – and last – time Indiana's Team opened up a season at home, making Saturday the ninth consecutive season in which the Boys in Blue will start their season on the road [insert joke about lovely Indiana springtime weather here]

That makes their season opener and road opener records obviously quite similar:

Season Openers: 3W-2L-4D

Road Openers: 3W-3L-3D

* record in both in USLC play: 3W-2L-0D

Saturday's match will mark the second time that Indy and Tampa Bay open the curtain against each other, the first being a scoreless draw at Al Lang on April 2, 2016.

Another Offseason Overhaul: Head Coach Mark Lowry was a busy man against this offseason, continuing his tinkering with the squad that began soon after his official welcome as the Eleven's sideline boss in November 2021.

Of the 23 players on this year's opening day roster, only six were full members of the squad for the Eleven's 2022 opener at Loudoun United FC at this time last March – GK Tim Trilk, DF Mechack Jerome, FW Jonas Fjeldberg, MF Bryam Rebellon, and Academy signings FW Luca Iaccino and MF Diego Sanchez (that doesn't count season-long loanee MF Alann Torres, who spent all of 2022 with Forward Madison FC).

This year's offseason overhaul includes 11 new faces (well, 10 new ones and 2020 returnee Cam Lindley), who'll join those six 2022 opening day holdovers, Torres, and five players – Solomon Asante, Jesus Vazquez, Juan Tejada, Robby Dambrot, and Academy goalkeeper Hayden Vostal – who were acquired during the 2022 season.

That leaves plenty of production to replace ...

- 28% of minutes played returns in 2023 (9,444 min of 33,660 mins.)
- 28% of games started (105 of 374 starts)
- 41% of assists (11 of 27 ... including team-high 6 by Asante)
- 31% of chances created (73 of 238 chances ... including team-high 36 by Asante)
- 29% of shots taken (96 of 329 shots taken)
- 26% of shots on goal (34 of 239)
- 46% of saves (53 of 115 saves ... all by Trilk)

FUN FACT: The longest tenured player with the Eleven on this year's squad? USL Academy contract signing Diego Sanchez, who is the only player entering his third season with Indiana's Team in 2023. The 18-year-old (as of last Dec. 12) from Indianapolis signed his initial USL Academy contract with the team on Aug. 9, 2021.

From GOAT to Coach: Ayoze was one of those players from the 2022 season who will not be on the field for the Eleven ... but that doesn't mean he's still not on the roster. The club's all time leader in appearances (126), starts (106), and assists (22) – figures amassed during a standout five seasons from 2018-22 that also included 13 goals (5th in

team history) – made the seamless transition from the field to the bench for 2023 and will serve as an assistant coach under Mark Lowry. In all, Ayoze logged 400 appearances during a 19-year professional career split nearly evenly between his native Spain and the USA.

Eleven on the USL Championship Charts

Aodhan Quinn enters the 2023 season high on the USL Championship's career regular season lists with 48 assists (3rd); 18,627 minutes played (4th), and 223 games played (223). The San Diego native's 14 assists in 2018 for Phoenix also ranks as the third most in a single USLC campaign, and he also possesses two of the league's longest assist-streaks with 5-games (2021 w/ PHX, T-2nd) and 4-game (2018 w/ Orange County SC) runs.

Solomon Asante ranks right behind Quinn in career assists with 47 helpers (4th). His 17 assists (1st), 123 shots (2nd), and 19 goals (3rd) for Phoenix in 2019 also stand out on the league's single-season records list, as does his 7-game scoring streak that season (T-2nd).

Sebastian Guenzatti is tied with Enzo Martinez and Cameron Iwasa for 10th in career regular season goals with 59. That mark is also the second most for a Championship player on a single team, his haul with Tampa Bay placing behind only Cameron Lancaster's 69 tallies for LouCity FC.

Comeback Around: Of Indy Eleven's 59 victories in USLC regular season play since the start of the 2018 campaign, nine were accomplished in comeback fashion, including three during the 2022 season, including the team's final victory of the season (4-1 W vs. Charleston on Oct. 8).

The only time Indy Eleven overcame a multiple goal deficit was on March 7, 2020, in its season opener at Memphis 901 FC, when the Eleven put four straight past Tim Howard to storm back from an 0-2 hole within the first 15 minutes to post a 4-2 victory.

Asante Makes His Mark: Solomon Asante's playmaking ability in his first season in Indy helped to rewrite the club's record books:

- His 3-assist game vs. Birmingham on Sept. 10 was the first in the club's nine-year history and second of his career (with PHX on 7/17 vs. LA2). He is one of only three players to accomplish the feat twice alongside (Emmanuel Ledesma & Jose Barril.
- Asante became the first player in club history to notch a pair of multi-assist games (3 vs. BHM on 9/10 and 2 @ CHS on 6/04)
- Asante finished 2022 tied for the second-most helpers in a single-season for Indy:

1) Ayoze – 8 assists, 2018 (all league)

T-2) Solomon Asante – 6 assists, 2022 (all league)

T-2) Dane Kelly – 6 assists, 2019 (5 league, 1 playoff)

T-2) Dylan Mares – 6 assists, 2016 (all league)

Eleven Park on the Horizon: In February, Indy Eleven and Keystone Group unveiled new designs for the Eleven Park neighborhood development that will transform the SW Quadrant of downtown Indianapolis – which includes a new 20,000-seat home for Indy Eleven and other events. Groundbreaking on the 20-acre site that was home to the former Diamond Chain factory will take place this May, with the team expecting to play games in the new venue by the summer of 2025. Indy Eleven posted the second-longest home undefeated streak in USL Championship history during its Lucas Oil Stadium tenure, going 28 games (21 wins, 7 draws) without defeat from July 2018-July 2020. It also collected a lengthy undefeated streak at "The Mike" during its NASL era, going 21 matches without a loss from Oct. 2015-May 2017.

Eleven Hits Season 10: The 2023 campaign marks Indy Eleven's tenth season of play in franchise history – and its sixth in the USL Championship since it joined the league ahead of the 2018 season after a four-year stint in the NASL.

The Boys in Blue have split their 150 games of USLC regular season play almost right down the middle with a 60W-59L-31D record (50.4%); the Eleven have also recorded two wins and two losses in the USL Championship Playoffs during its appearances in 2018 (1 loss) and 2019 (2 wins, 1 loss).
